*It's just about Chico. It always is. More specifically, it's about Chico's need for attention. Just look at the guy's history. It's undeniable.*

Now while I wouldn't go as far as saying he does it for attention all the time, I suspect he's done it in various occasions. Now this is something of which I've been guilty and still have to keep it in check, at times this vigilance fails. The problem here is that this need for attention/approval can be very subtle and in fact you can find yourself believing there is something wrong with everyone else.... hey after all you keep doing your best as to keep it polite and peaceful. Or you could find yourself in Chico's current state, where you'll want to come up with anything to protect your investment by trying to please everyone else as a means to build a shield for your own psychological 'stability'.

I myself have been in these kind of scenarios and still have to remain vigilant, so I'm not making this just about Chicodoodoo. But hey I'll use his case as a point of reference and see if I can come up with something about human psychological dynamics, which also include my own crap.

Now it's time for the review and feedback loops, there is room for tiny and big fuck ups of mine:

*A modest epiphany -- here's what I realized.*

Remind the audience how humble you are. A subtle mask, when put into contrast with the whole context, some would think this is pedantic.

*Why are some people at war with me? I am not a warrior. By that, I mean I make no effort to antagonize or attack others. I believe in "live and let live". I believe in treating others no worse than I would want to be treated. I believe in doing no harm. I believe in leaving others in peace.*

*But, there are times when people attack me as if I have maliciously attacked them. Not often, but it happens. Typically, I have no clue what I have done to provoke such an attack. It's like, where did that come from? When I analyze it, I see in the attacker emotions running rampant, misperceptions, misunderstandings, and false beliefs. I consider it to be their problem. Naturally, when attacked, I defend myself in direct measure to the attack, though usually at a reduced scale. After all, I'm not really interested in doing any harm.*

I'm seeing an obsession here, where the subject would like to live by "high standards" of morality. In a sense he needs confirmation of his way of life, meaning he'll seek to verify his "moral status" by getting contrast with the reactions of other people, at some point he enters the alternative scene and expects to see people who strive for peace, unity and truth. But oh surprise, it quite doesn't go as expected, this would cause conflict in the subject's psyche so a new trick has to be created: Expect everyone else to follow the Golden Rule, hey after all this is the logical and most healthy conclusion and it's quite simple too. To an extent this avoids inner conflict and the psyche can just say: "well they are just not living up to it", "they are flawed and aggressive, but hey I work hard for it". Without realizing it, the subject has shoved down his moralistic principles down people's throats; he doesn't think this can be annoying to some since the definition of the Golden Rule seems sensible enough: "'Do unto others as you would have them do unto you". The language is nice, what could go wrong? Share love, receive love... right? The subject has projected the conclusion of his mind into the world; indeed the Golden Rule should be universal. Yeah this can be seen as pedantry and the subject isn't even aware.

Notice this bit:

*Naturally, when attacked, I defend myself in direct measure to the attack, though usually at a reduced scale. After all, I'm not really interested in doing any harm.*

The response has to be toned down, if the defence was as strong as or stronger than the attack, then there would be a heavy conflict of interest with the Golden Rule. The subject thinks he may start to become a war machine if he doesn't tone it down or restrains himself. The subject would create amiable and polite language as a means to avoid conflict with the other person while at the same time he fools himself by thinking he can keep peace if he just continues doing this, more important to him is the "fact" that he has respected the glorified Golden Rule.

*Because I am not a warrior, many people see me a man of peace. Given the members waging war against me on Nexus, this perspective must be wrong.*

At this point the subject was more concerned about keeping his "holy" mask without even realizing it. He thinks the Golden Rule works miracles and now everyone else has fallen in line, meaning people see a peaceful man. In fact this is a subtle language used as a tool to convince himself of the "flawlessness" of the Golden Rule, to keep this rule alive he thinks everyone else is gonna see and give peace to him.

*So, and this is key, I am also not a peacemaker. By that, I mean I consider the attacker to have a problem that he needs to deal with. It is one of those times when I agree with people that emphasize looking within. From my perspective, the attacker needs to look within and figure out why he reacts the way he does. Those are his emotions, and he needs to deal with them. Hey, it's what I do when my emotions run rampant, so if it's good enough for me; it should be good enough for others.*

Even if the subject doesn't understand much about psychological/philosophical/existential self-contemplation he'd still speak about it. Now in order to avoid further inner conflict, he blames everything on the attacker. The possibility of him being part of the problem is blown into oblivion, after all he's been trying so hard to live and die by the Golden Rule. Now he expects everyone else to become him: "if it works for me, it should be good enough for everyone else". Yes your majesty, king of the hill, your method is gospel... or so is the subtle message.

*Ah, but the Golden Rule doesn't exactly say to expect from others what you expect from yourself, now does it.*

It does, but the language is clever. The Golden Rule has made you believe this is not about you, it has whispered this into your ears: "I'm am your lord and master, follow me, obey me and you shall be a beacon of morality, beacon of empathy and selflessness". It has seduced you and in the process you think everyone else is a piece of shit. In fact I can see this in the dynamic you establish with Truthhunter; despite his pedantry you pat him in the back and elevate him because he has embodied the Golden Rule... he's a reflection of your mental utopia.

*I can see a problem in me that I could never see before. I'm beginning to see the advantages of being a peacemaker. I am very weak in this area. That would make sense -- if I am not a warrior, I would rarely need peacemaking skills, especially if I can defend myself. But given the members upset at me at Nexus, I should clearly work on developing some peacemaking skills.*

Now the subject finds himself a conflict, but still he's obsessed with the Golden Rule, meaning he has an obsession with receiving approval from the audience. Yet there is another martyr element: everyone else is against him, this is terrifying... the Golden Rule is failing to provide shelter, so he better comes up with some diplomatic abilities to try and keep the paradigm together while he fools himself once more, he thinks he's changing, but actually he's putting make-up on his inner monster.

*If I'm not a warrior, and I'm not a peacemaker, then what am I? Reviewing my life, I am clearly a truth-seeker and a truth-teller. That doesn't mean I have the truth, of course. I can be fooled, and I can be wrong, but I work very hard to not be either of those.*

BINGO!!! The subject is afraid to be wrong, he's afraid of f'king it up. That's why he tries to remain in limbo as long as possible, to hide from himself, his own fear. Yes the subject is afraid to move, to take a stance. If it was up to him he would create a neutral world. The subject has ignored the fact that being wrong and being fooled (by oneself or others) can be capitalized on. If he is wrong in his judgement then the Golden Rule will punish him... GOLDEN KARMA BABY!! "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you".

*So where does that leave us? People that would be upset by the truth or wish it hidden will war on me with great vigor. If I tell the truth, at least what they see as truth, it will provoke them, and war will result. People that cherish comfort and tranquility will be upset by this war. They will cry out for peace, and cry out for peacemakers. They will condemn both warring parties, those fighting for truth, and those fighting against it. They will be willing to silence truth to obtain peace.*

This is quite something. The subject is willing to project this dynamic unto everyone else and he may be right to an extent. But he can't see he is part of this! He can't stand the fact that he's prone to fall into this category... that's why he will be the truth crusader, the peacemaker... but of holy shit!!! Both camps are gonna get angry. The subject does not want to cause war, but he doesn't want to kill truth because of this... but there's the Golden Rule too. So he would rather inhabit Limbo.

I'm guessing you are going through a phase where you are reconfiguring your psyche, dealing with inner conflict. I myself have been there more times than I care to remember and it can create friction with other people. Sometimes I didn't even realize most of the problem had something to do with me, I would realize it months after X or Y incident. One would hope these mirror dynamics can help oneself to make corrections as soon as possible. In a sense they can shed light on blind spots. Not very pretty, not very nice, but I'd say it's worth it.
